Rules of Calculating Publication Points for Doctoral Degree in Electronics Group

Approved by the Department and Institute General Meeting on November 22, 1991.

I. Graduation Requirements

- 1. For students who spent four years or more to complete the program, a minimum of 20 publication points is required. The accumulated publication points must contain at least 15 points from publications of Journal Papers.
- 2. For students who spent less than four years to complete the program, five additional publication points are required per semester reduced (ten points for two semesters, etc.). The required points attributed to publication of Journal Papers is increase proportionally (18.75 publication points for 1 semester, 22.5 publication points for 2 semesters, etc).

II. Rules for Ranking Papers and Calculating Publication Points

- 1. In any concerned year, journals which are listed in SCI or SCIE and included in any category of JCR, are ranked according to their Impact Factors. The top one-third journals are classified as class A, over one-third to two-thirds are class B, and over two-thirds to 100% are class C.
- 2. All journals are ranked according to JCR and divided into three classes of A, B, and C. The total publication points are calculated by the following rules: 10 points for each class A paper, 7.5 points for each class B paper, and 5 points for each class C paper.
- 3. For papers published in international academic conferences and for papers published in journals which are not listed in the aforementioned, 3 publication points are granted for each paper. For paper published in domestic academic conference, 1 publication point is granted for each paper.
